

Making a COVID-19 Vaccine Appointment

Only for those that live or work in Kendall County

1. Visit our website at www.kendallhealth.org



2. Look for the COVID-19 Vaccine teal icon and click on it.

3. Choose which dose (1st or 2nd) you need to schedule an appointment for.




4. Read the information on the appointment portal page.

5. Scroll down, under the calendar icon, you will see clinic date options, select a date.



6. The date will only be a live link (able to schedule appointment) if the health department has that vaccine available. If it says, "coming soon", we do not have the vaccine at this time. Please check back often.

7. Once you click a live link, choose a date to book a ticket. Please look for a green time slot. Click the time slot and add the appointment to your "cart." Once the ticket has been added to your cart, please click continue. Please add your email and personal information, click continue. Make sure everything is looks correct and submit registration.



The program gives you 5 minutes to schedule an appointment.

8. Once you make an appointment, you will receive a confirmation email that contains a 5-digit code and an additional link. Once you click the order details link in your email, you can download your ticket. Print that ticket and bring it to the appointment. Tickets can also be accessed via your smartphone. If you added your cell phone number during registration, you will receive a confirmation text. If you did not receive an email or text, you did not schedule an appointment.

9. Please bring evidence that you live (driver's license) or work (pay stub, work identification) in Kendall County to be eligible for your appointment. You will be DENIED a vaccine if you do not live or work in Kendall County.

2nd DOSE

KCHD ensures there will be sufficient vaccine appointments for all those in need of a 2nd dose.

- 2nd doses for Moderna vaccine can be scheduled between 28 and 42 days after your first dose.
- 2nd doses for Pfizer vaccine can be scheduled between 21 and 42 days after your first dose.

Please check back as second dose slots will be added throughout the week.

Residents must access the appointment portals to register for their own COVID-19 Vaccine appointment day and time. Appointments will fill up fast. Clinics will be added throughout the week for the following week based on vaccine supply. Please continue to check back often for available time slots.

Vaccine supply is limited, please be patient.
